In 2012, Cecilia Giménez stared horrified as water dripped onto a picture of the face of Christ. Appalled by the crumbling state of the frescoes on the walls of her local church in Borja, Spain, the 81-year-old amateur watercolour painter offered to restore the picture. Unfortunately, with little training or experience, Cecilia's efforts weren't hugely successful. The resulting work was likened to a "crayon sketch of a very hairy monkey in an ill-fitting tunic," attracting international criticism and sparking online memes still popular today.

Fundraising, like conservation, is a skilled job. When done well, it provides the foundation for performances, exhibitions, and cultural experiences. It removes barriers to life-changing cultural moments and fosters the next generation of creative talent.

However, success requires more than enthusiasm. Inadequate fundraising skills risk long-term damage to our organisations, generous donors, and the broader sector.

For five years, the RAISE programme collaborated with the Chartered Institute of Fundraising, its Cultural Sector Network, and Young Arts Fundraisers to elevate cultural fundraising in England. This report celebrates RAISE's impact on fundraisers and their organisations.

We're hugely proud of this programme and grateful to those who contributed.

However, this is not "job done". Over the past five years, cultural fundraisers faced mounting pressures due to COVID, rising energy costs, and inflation. This situation won't change soon. With stretched funding sources, there's increasing pressure to secure philanthropic income.

To fulfil the country's cultural ambitions, we can't rely solely on amateurs. Meeting our organisations' and supporters' needs requires a skilled, nationwide fundraising workforce committed to best practices. In essence, to offer high-quality cultural experiences nationwide, cultural organisations need high-quality fundraisers.

We'll continue working with partners and stakeholders to advocate for cultural fundraising investment, ensuring fundraisers for arts, culture, and heritage can create memorable, accessible experiences for years to come.

### RAISE: Arts, Culture & Heritage (RAISE)


Is a **Chartered Institute of Fundraising's**<sup>1</sup> programme of support for arts, culture and heritage fundraisers across England through **networking events**, **mentoring** and **professional development opportunities**. Funded by the **Arts Council England** for a period of five years (April 2018 to September 2023), the programme was delivered in partnership with the Chartered Institute's **Cultural Sector Network** and **Young Arts Fundraisers** to:



RAISE has successfully engaged with a wide range of fundraisers from the arts and culture sector across England, and beyond. In line with its aims, the programme prioritised applications from individuals who self-identified as part of the following communities:



### **Participants' Organisations**




The RAISE programme has facilitated greater geographical diversity and representation within the arts and culture sector amongst fundraisers.

Whilst London remains the focus of employment and activity in the fundraising and philanthropic sector, RAISE has successfully widened access to fundraising support across England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland through its online offer.








### **NENTO**

It aims to equip early-career arts fundraisers with the advice, networks, and peer support that they need to succeed.


### The EVOLVE programme

Matches early-career fundraisers in the arts and culture sector with senior or director level development professionals.

Pairs participants together as 'buddies' to build long-term supportive relationships amongst peers. Six sessions of peer learning and networking, utilising action learning and coaching methods, featuring invited speakers and participant-driven agendas.

Spotlights cohort participants' work and careers via blog posts, articles and interviews.

Supports programme alumni with further advice and networking opportunities.

### Aims and aspirations from RAISE events bursary


Participants hoped to achieve a variety of individual and organisational aims and aspirations from attending events and conferences as a result of bursary support:



### A. Impact on participants BEFORE & AFTER accessing the RAISE programme

The attribution of the **RAISE** programme to a range of practical and professional development impacts is assessed by participants to be very high:

### B. Individual Fundraising achievements attributed to the RAISE programme

The **RAISE** programme can be linked, to varying degrees, to a range of fundraising achievements. Whilst the attribution of programme impact to overall fundraising achievements is difficult to assess, programme participants outlined a range of individual and organisational successes that have been supported by their experiences. These are highlighted through the quotes below.



Settling into a new job and securing £250k worth of new income in my first six months!

Within the first six months of my role, I was tasked with raising funds for a young artist programme within my organisation. With the help of my mentor, I learnt how to structure efficient cases for support and through targeted and proficient applications was able to raise the majority of funds for the first year of the programme within the first six months in my position!

## **IMPACTS**

### C. Developments within the Chartered Institute and programme's partners

The RAISE programme has changed the way that the Chartered Institute engages with arts and culture sector fundraisers and organisations by increasing their profile through a combination of representation, empowerment, upskilling and diversification. Key achievements include:

### RAISE LEGACY

RAISE has nurtured regional networks of fundraisers in the arts and culture sector, empowering fundraisers with skills and confidence to enhance productivity and support sector growth.

RAISE bursaries have increased the number of fundraisers in the arts and culture sector accessing professional development opportunities, instilling confidence in their capacity to apply advanced fundraising skills and implement more effective techniques for their organisations.

RAISE developed a range of resources including a suite of free online tools to enable individuals and organisations to continue receiving support and guidance.

The EVOLVE programme expanded its reach and adapted to the needs of early-career fundraisers to provide a rounded offer from both experienced mentors and peer network. This has supported early-career fundraisers to change the way they contribute to their organisation's resilience and improve their careers.

RAISE increased levels of confidence amongst arts and culture fundraisers through its offer of bursaries, mentoring and networking which will, in time, support the arts and culture fundraising sector.

### Ongoing need and recommendations

Whilst the **RAISE** programme has provided the learning and emerging impacts to support fundraisers in the arts and cultural sector, consultation highlights there is a need to maintain support if these impacts are to the sustained and built on by:

- ✓ Continuing to encourage the sector to be less "London-centric"
- Sustaining actions to increase diversity in arts fundraising, particularly for individuals that self-identify as part of the global majority, d/Deaf and disabled and from a working class background.
- Continuing to encourage and provide opportunities for early-career fundraisers to increase their profile and career progression.
- Maintaining local networking opportunities for fundraisers experiencing similar issues.
- The introduction of a national 'sector barometer' poll to track changes in key indicators of impact (e.g., skills, knowledge, and competency), and identify emerging sector issues for arts and culture sector fundraisers can inform future funding and support down to a local level.
- Developing packages of CEIAG<sup>3</sup> support to publicise fundraising as a career option in schools and colleges will provide the sector with a base of skills to minimise the need for ongoing support packages.
- ✓ Promoting wider cultural networks across sector organisations.



I wish there were more programmes such as this, specifically fundraising tailored to the arts. We all need all the help we can get to increase income to help the sector survive and thrive.
